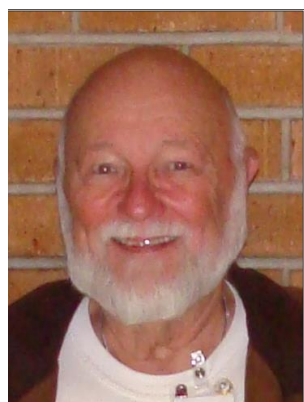


Members – Gone But Not Forgotten
